These people are trained to provide advice and guidance for staff on safeguarding and child-protection issues and making referrals to other agencies.

All school staff and volunteers have a responsibility to ensure that children and young people are safe in school.

If you have concerns about a child's welfare that you believe may be a child protection issue you should:

- Treat the concern seriously and take all reasonable steps to protect the child
- Call an ambulance if urgent medical attention is needed
- Avoid asking the child leading questions
- Reassure the child
- Report your concerns immediately to the Designated Safeguarding Lead or their deputy
- Record the incident on CPOMS as soon as possible.

The school recognises that there may be circumstances where staff, volunteers and pupils feel unable to raise concerns or incidents of malpractice within the school environment as there is reasonable doubt that these would be dealt with adequately.

All staff and volunteers have a legal duty to raise concerns where they feel individuals or schools are failing to safeguard and promote the welfare of children.
