Topic: Being Me

Literacy

Phonics: Please watch the phonics videos (link below- suggested set 1&2 at least). Please review tricky words using the tricky word PowerPoint (simply get children to say each word as they flash onto the screen). Now Choose 6 tricky words from phases 2-4 that your child is struggling with. Can they read them and write them down? There are additional tricky word videos on the phonics youtube channel- please have a look if you're interested.

Reading: Re-watch the story video 'Julian is a Mermaid' by Jessica Love. Ask your child to reflect on the story- answer the following questions (no need for any written answers):

- What is your favourite part of the story? Why?
- What makes you similar to Julian?
- What makes you different to Julian?
- How does this story make you feel? Why?
- Are there any parts of the story you would change? Why?

Writing: Use your story plan to write your own version of 'Julian is a Mermaid'.

Challenge: Can you check your work for capital letters and full stops?
Remember: after every full stop there needs to be a capital letter.

Maths: REVIEW- Operations within 20

This week, children will be reviewing operations within 20 (e.g. adding, subtracting, doubling, halving, sharing, ordering, comparing, estimating and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s). By now, the children should have secured most of these skills (counting in 2s etc. is above national expectations for reception). This week, we will focus on challenges within these skills.

Warm up: Can you count up to 20 in 2s? What about 5s? 10s? Can you count out 20 counters and group these into 2s, 5s and 10s to help you? Can you spot which numbers are even and which numbers are odd?

Next, complete the challenges in the picture! Remember: it is always best to use concrete objects for mathematics, such as counters (could be pasta, cubes, anything!)

Topic: Expressive art & design- Music
