Topic: Under the Sea: Looking after our World

Literacy

Phonics: Please watch the phonics videos (link below- suggested set 1&2 at least). Please review tricky words using the tricky word PowerPoint (simply get children to say each word as they flash onto the screen). Now Choose 6 tricky words from phases 2-4 that your child is struggling with. Can they read them and write them down? There are additional tricky word videos on the phonics youtube channel- please have a look if you're interested.

Reading: Re-watch the literacy video from yesterday- The Whale's Tale (See link on website). Discuss the following questions with your child:

- What happened at the beginning of the story? In the middle? At the end?
- What could the boy have said when he dropped the net?
- How was he feeling?
- Whose responsibility is it to look after our world and our seas? Why?
- Who can't help us? Why can't they help?

Writing: Please continue the story from yesterday, using the picture on the website as a writing frame. Children need to complete the ending of the story using pictures as a stimulus.

Challenge: can you use conjunctions in your sentences to make them longer? E.g. and, so, because.

Maths: REVIEW- shape, space & measure- 3D Shapes

Please have a look back over all the activities from this week. Where are your child's strengths and weaknesses? 3D shape names can be difficult to master, so please focus on ensuring your child knows these securely.

Topic: Expressive art & design- Music
