Literacy: Please watch the phonics videos (link below- suggested set 1&2 at least).

Writing: LINKED TO TOPIC- can you research your favourite dinosaur and create a fact file? You could find out where they lived, what they ate and what they looked like. Can you find out which dinosaur had the longest tail? ADULT TIP: using a child friendly web search will give better results e.g. kidrex- <https://www.alarms.org/kidrex/>

Challenge: How many different sentences can you write?

Maths: watch number blocks video- 19 (see link below). There is also a number 19 teaching PowerPoint for extra information. Can children match the number on the ice-cream with the correct number of dots? You could either print and cut these, or even better, children could draw them. The key concept here is can children count objects which cannot be moved? Another skill is subitising- can children recognise a quantity from a picture? (Adults can only really do this accurately up to about 6 or 7, so we don't expect children to be able to do it with teen numbers! It is a good exercise to see if children can recognise patterns within dots e.g. 3 rows of 3 = 9).

Challenge: Can you estimate how many dots are there before you count them? Can you reflect on how accurate your estimate was? E.g. can children recognise that if they guessed 8 and the answer was 17, this is quite far away (you can show this with objects if it is easier!)
