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Tips for making your animal model:

Printing:

- Print your model on card stock rather than paper.
- Check your print preview before printing to make sure all of the pieces are within the print area. (Pages are US letter-sized. You may need to adjust your printer settings for best fit.)
- You may wish to take your model to a store that offers printing services for a high quality print finish.

Making:

- Small scissors work well for cutting smaller pieces.
- Using a glue that is tacky will help the pieces hold together well while you're assembling the model.
- To make the folding easier and neater, score the fold lines. To do this, take an empty ballpoint pen or mechanical pencil without lead and run it along the fold lines. Use a ruler to help keep your line straight.
- Once finished, you may like to draw over the dotted white lines with a marker so they don't show on your finished model.
- Let your model dry thoroughly before handling it.
- Have FUN playing with your new animal model!



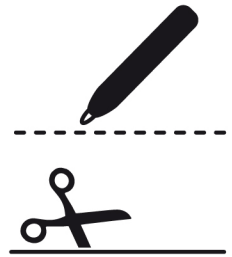
How to Assemble the Polar Bear Model

You will need:

- Printed model
- Scissors
- Glue
- Empty ballpoint pen
OR mechanical pencil without lead
- Ruler

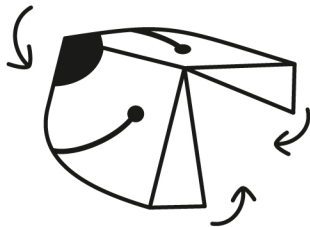
Tips for assembling the model:

- ① Before cutting out the pieces, take an empty ballpoint pen (or mechanical pencil without lead) and run the tip along all the dotted lines, pressing a little bit. This will make it easier to fold those parts of the model. Use a ruler to help with the straight lines.
- ② Cut out all of the pieces and fold the parts on the dotted lines. Get ready to glue and have fun!



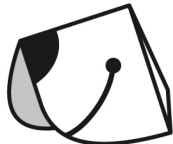
The snout:

Fold on the dotted lines.

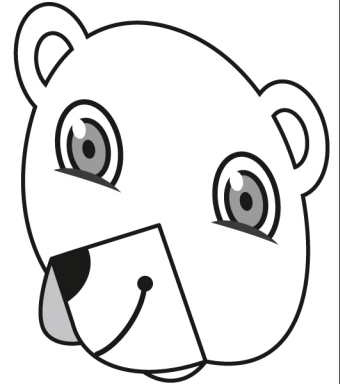
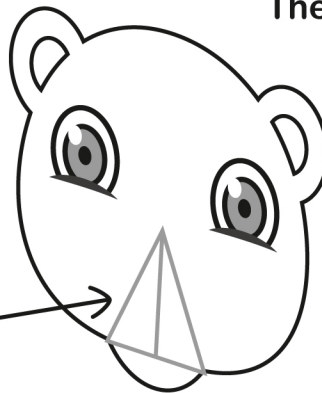


Fold these flaps in.

Glue snout to the head.



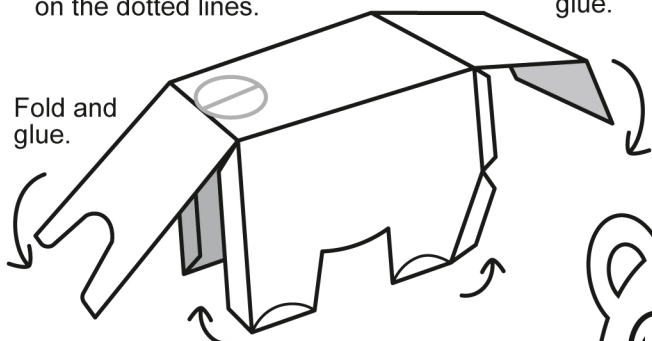
The head:

Fold and glue.



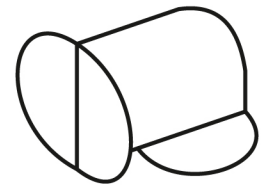
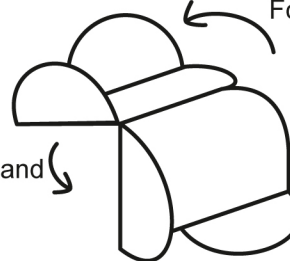
Fold the flaps.

Fold all flaps.

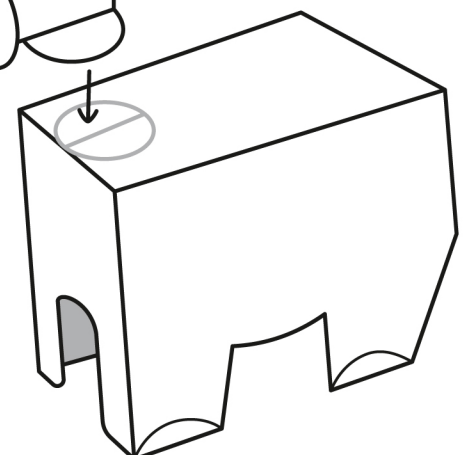
Fold and glue.



Glue the neck to the body.

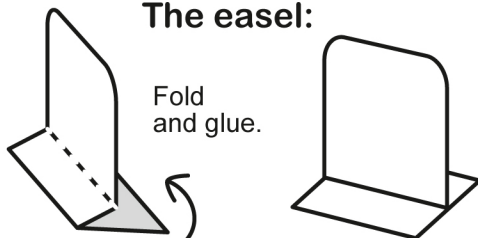


Glue the head to the neck.

Fold and glue.



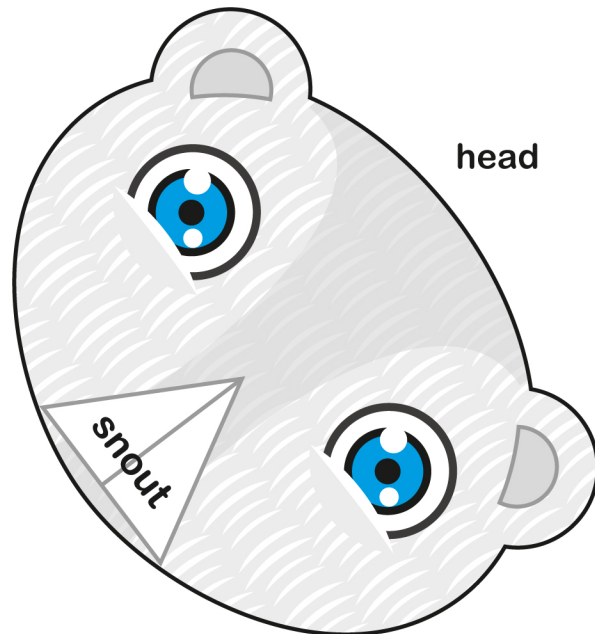
