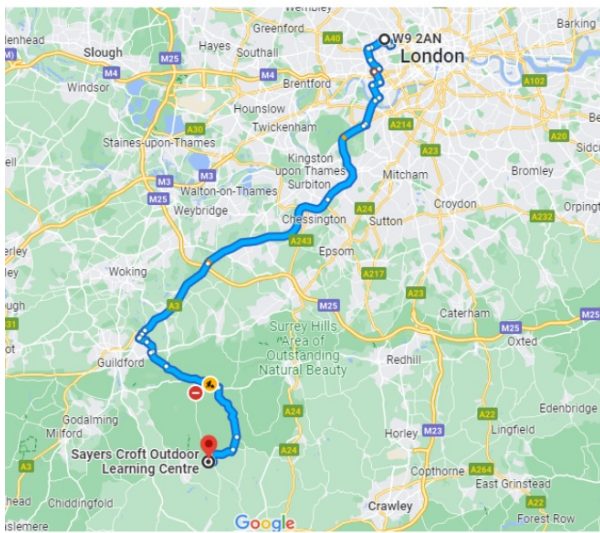

## Key information

We have some medication at school. If there is any other medication you want your child to have - e.g. piriton or Calpol - it must be named and given to myself on Monday 29th September.

Children are not allowed to bring phones, tablets or smart watches to the premises at all.

## What to bring?

Sayers Croft will supply you with bedding, safety and educational equipment for your specific activities. Below is a general list of the kind of stuff you will need to think about bringing. Make sure you **have your name on all things** that belong to you and you can carry your bag as you will need to carry it to your chalet:

- o Arrive in comfortable clothing for travel & activities
  - o 3 x old outfits (pond dipping) - long trousers
    - o Extra socks and underwear
    - o Comfort item
    - o Plastic bag for dirty or wet clothes
- o Wellies (if you have them – Sayers Croft do have some spares)
  - o 2 x pairs of shoes (you don't mind getting dirty)
  - o Pyjamas and slippers / slipper socks
    - o Towel and toiletries
  - o > £5 for tuck shop (in change!)

    - o Raincoat

  - o Medicine or allergy medication

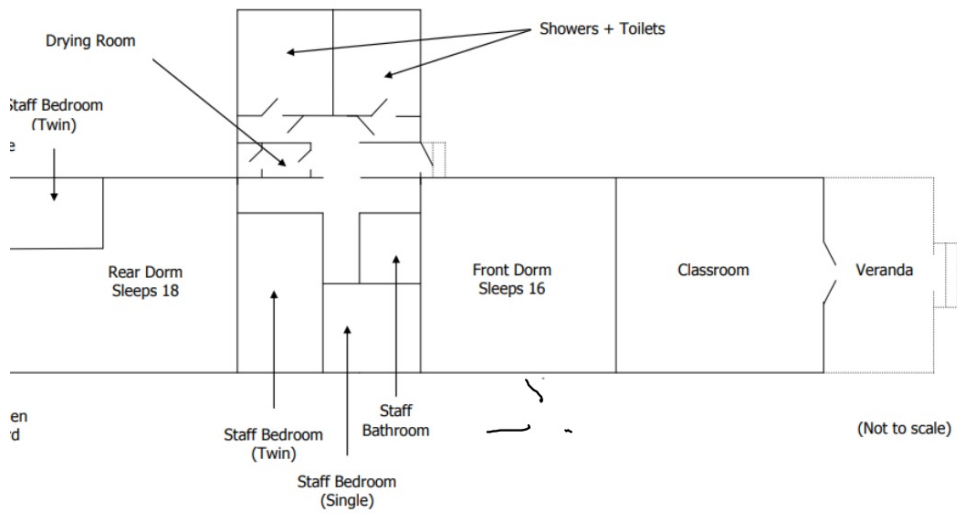

# Homework

Subject & Year group	Homework set
<p><b>English</b> All years Daily reading</p>	<p><b>Reception and KS1</b> children: <b>10</b> minutes 5 x a week. Parents need to write a short comment in the diary for each day and sign it at the end of the week. <b>Books and diaries need to be in school every day.</b></p> <p>To begin with, if your child is in Reception, they will receive wordless picture books. Please share this book with your child and talk about the story and characters as well as practising the sounds. More information about Reception reading will follow at the Reception Phonics Workshop on 12<sup>th</sup> September at 9am.</p> <p><b>KS2 children:</b> 20 minutes 5x a week.</p> <p>Children need to write the title of the book as well as the page numbers in their diary and this needs to be signed by an adult on a Friday. There are lots of timetabled opportunities for the children to read their book throughout the week so <b>books and diaries need to be in school every day.</b></p> <p>All diaries will be checked on a Friday and if your child has not completed their reading homework (5 entries) you will receive a text home reminding you to read with your child.</p>
<p><b>Spellings</b> Years 1-6</p>	<p>Spelling lists will be sent home in your child's homework book. They will need to do a written task with the spellings in their homework books which involves writing a sentence for each of the spelling words.</p> <p>The children will have a spelling test on Friday.</p>
<p><b>Bedrock Vocabulary</b> Years 3-6</p>	<p>Children need to log in twice a week and complete at least 2 x 20-minute sessions. Logins will be stuck into your child's diary next week.</p> <p>Year 3 parents, you will receive an introductory letter next week.</p>
<p><b>Maths Online</b> Years 1-6</p>	<p>Timetables Rockstars/ NumBots at least 3 x a week for 10 minutes</p> <p>Logins will be stuck into your child's diary next week.</p>

## SATs

3 x Maths SATs (1 arithmetic paper and 2 problem solving / reasoning) - times tables essential by Christmas!

1 x Reading paper

1 x SPAG paper

- Normally in the beginning of May but no fixed date yet
  - SATs booster classes throughout the year
- Work at home = so important! Doing times tables with them, listening to them read and asking questions "how do you know \_\_\_\_ is feeling \_\_\_\_?" etc

## Attendance and Punctuality



If your child is unable to attend school due to an unexpected reason, you must notify the school office by 9:30am.

New National Government guidelines from September 2024.

If any child is absent from school due to a term time holiday, or any other unauthorised reason, we will be required to refer the case to the Local Authority.

The LA will then assess the situation and may choose to issue a fine. In the first instance, payment of a penalty notice within 21 days is £80 and payment after this time but within 28 days is £160.

Circumstances where a Penalty Notice may be issued:

- cases of overt truancy
- cases of parentally condoned absence, where this can be demonstrated.
- instances where parents take children out of school for holidays/leave in term time.
- instances of excessive delayed return from holidays/leave in term-time.
- persistent lateness (unauthorised)

We will be required to make a referral when:

- a pupil has failed to attend school regularly over a 10-week period (when their attendance has fallen below 85%)
- and/or holiday/leave amounting to 10 or more sessions (5 days) is deliberately taken in term time

Please check the website for term dates.

## Secondary School Transition



- apply online 24/7
- research the schools you want to apply to (Open days etc)
- read each schools admissions criteria
  - **apply for 5 schools**
- list schools in order of preference
- your outcome is emailed during the evening of March 2nd 2026

Deadline: 31st October 2025



## Overview of the Process

- If your child was born between 1 September 2014 to 31 August 2015 they should be applying for a school place for September 2026. The application *must* be submitted by **Friday 31 October 2025**.
- The application is made to the borough in whose administrative area you live (i.e. where you pay your Council Tax).
- You can name up to **6** schools and can apply for schools that are in other boroughs.
- All preferences are treated *equally*. This means that wherever you place a particular school it will be treated the same way as any other applicant for that school. The details regarding where you ranked the preference are *not* shared with the school.
- Your preferences should reflect the schools you most wish your child to receive a place at.

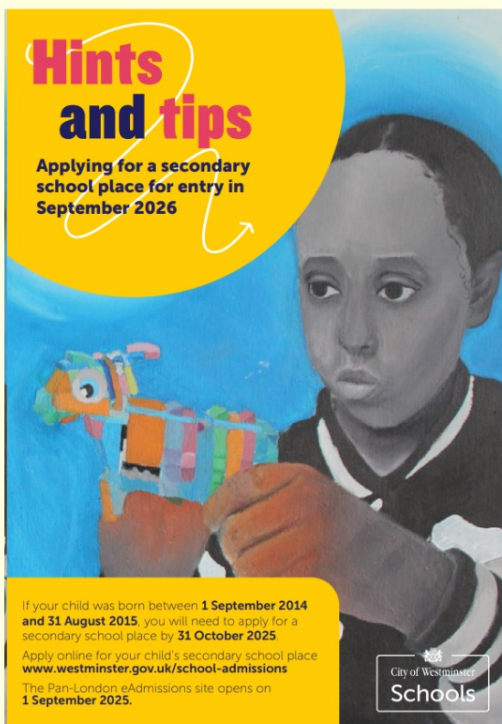
