## What level should my child be at?

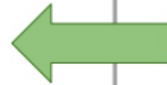
Children are given a level in Reading, Writing, Maths and GPS.

GDS - Higher Standard

EXS - Expected Standard

WTS - Working Towards the Expected Standard

BLW - Working Below the Standard of the test



## What is a scaled score?

It is planned that 100 will always represent the 'national standard'.

Each pupil's raw test score will therefore be converted into a score on the scale, either at, above or below 100.

The scale will have a lower end point of 80 and an upper end point above 120.

A child who achieves the 'national standard' (a score of 100) will be judged to have demonstrated sufficient knowledge in the areas assessed by the tests.

Each pupil receives:

- a raw score (number of raw marks awarded);
- a scaled score in each tested subject; confirmation of whether or not they attained the national standard.

**GDS - Higher Standard** Above 110 Scaled Score

**EXS - Expected Standard** Between 100 and 110 Scaled Score

**WTS - Working Towards the Expected Standard** Below 100

**BLW - Working Below the Standard of the test**

## How is SATS week organised?

1. Children to arrive between 8-8:15am where we can have a breakfast together every day
- A timetable is issued to school, telling us on which days/sessions tests must be administered.
  - All children must sit the tests on the allocated day.
  - Test papers can only be opened 1 hour before the tests begin.
  - Tests are completed in classrooms, with any displays that may help covered over.
- Some children are divided into groups for test administration to ensure they are properly supported and feel secure

## What are we doing in school?

### Boosters

1. Maths - every Monday in small groups [arithmetic]
2. Reading - every Tuesday morning at 8am [reading skills]
3. SPAG - every Wednesday morning at 8:30 [CPG books]

### Lessons

1. Maths - weekly arithmetic tests, daily times tables, arithmetic starters, problem solving integrated into the lesson
2. Guided reading sessions filled with discussion, questions, predictions
3. SPAG 3x a week working on an area of punctuation and SPAG starters in every English lesson
